In February and March of 2005, Eddie, Gaston, Hanley and Jules graduated from Guiding Eyes for the Blind. Eddie and Hanely both graduated from the Home Training program in January. Eddie's was raised by Carol Deeley and family and his vet sponsor was Northwoods Animal and the Deeley's were his food sponsor. Hanley was raised by Wendy & Jim Bierwirth and his vet sponsor was Pet Housecalls and his food sponsor was the Bierwirths.

Gaston graduated in February and is now living in New Orleans and Jules graduated in March and is now living in Washington, DC. Jenice Heck & Gaston

February's graduating class included two ACTION (Accelerated Client Training Option) students, he first of whom is Jenice Heck from New Orleans, Louisiana. Jenice first chose to come to GEB through research on the Internet. Now she is returning for Gaston, her second dog. (She brought her former four-legged pal along with her to be placed in GEB's Adoption Program.) Jenice was termed legally blind at birth as the result of Leber's Congenital Amaurosis (a gene deficiency). Now 32, Jenice is married and is happily three months pregnant with her first child. Self-described as outgoing, a bit stubborn but compassionate, Jenice feels that she has achieved most, if not all, of her life goals. After training at Louisiana State University Medical Center, she became a Licensed Occupational Therapist and Practitioner. She then earned her Masters in Mass Communications from

LSU at Baton Rouge and is currently employed as Program Coordinator of Adult Education and Community Relations for The Light House for the Blind. Jenice's new dog, Gaston, is easygoing, playful and a good worker. She is certain he will enable her to travel about with more confidence and greater ease when they are home in Louisiana together. Jenice describes GEB as "top-notch quality - the very best there is." She added, "The trainers know what they're doing, are totally dedicated, and really deliver the goods."

Gaston was raised by Danny and Walt Overcash of Mooresville, NC. Gaston's vet sponsor was Lakewood Veterinary Hospital and the Overcash family was his food sponsor.

Peter Altschul & Jules

An ACTION (Accelerated Client Training Option) student, Peter Altschul, from Washington DC, grew up as a "local boy," attending schools in nearby Pleasantville, New York. Peter has been blind since birth (cause undiagnosed) and

has returned to Guiding Eyes for the Blind to claim his fifth dog, Jules. He recounts that his knowledge of Braille was passed on to him through his mom who studied and obtained the requisite skills and then taught them to her son. Yeah, Mom! Peter was hard pressed to describe his own personality, so we switched the question to: "What sort of people do you seek as your friends?" That brought a quick response, which actually mirrored his own persona: those who have a sense of humor, who are sharp, street smart, have high energy, and are committed to a goal in life. Enabling Peter to reach his goals in life were his studies at Columbia University, where he earned a Masters Degree. Focusing on Organizational Psychology, Peter's current employment is helping organizations to be more effective by conducting training sessions to enable them to deal with issues such as conflict management, diversity, etc. He also serves as a member of the American Council for the Blind. Citing the excellence of GEB's instructors in knowledgeable and careful dog-to-student partnering, Peter states that Jules is a great match for his own personality: "He's smart, a great worker, and is pro-

active." Peter recalled that a bonding was most evident when they first met, whereupon Jules impulsively had jumped up onto his new master's lap. Peter does

admit to some needed moments of relaxation and enjoyment. He loves music and as a percussionist appreciates not only listening to a beat, but also creating his own arrangements, using a variety of styles. Peter's connection with Guiding Eyes for the Blind came as a result of its close proximity to his hometown when he claimed his first dog 26 years ago. But more than that, he says, "This is a terrific school. I am very blessed to have had their dogs. I have also been fascinated to observe how GEB works. It is a true model of how all organizations should be conducted."

Jules was raised by Susan Shinn and family of Charlotte, NC. Jules' vet sponsor was Randall Veterinary Hospital of Mooresville and the Shinn family was his food sponsor.

Driving Directions to St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Raleigh for the Spring Evaluation:

<u>From I-95</u>: Exit onto 64 West/Raleigh. New Hope Rd intersects Hwy 64 approx. 5 miles from the Knightdale water tower. Look for an Exxon and turn right at the traffic light. Continue for approx. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile. St. Marks will be on your left, just beyond the 1st traffic light.

<u>From 440 Beltline</u>: Exit onto 64 East/RockyMount. New Hope Rd crosses Hwy 64/New Bern Ave at the 3^{rd} traffic light where you will turn left. Look for an Exxon on your left just before the intersection. Travel approx. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile. St. Marks will be on your left, just beyond the 1^{st} traffic light.
